

Bars and restaurants close to ULB Solbosch campus

Bois de la Cambre

Just a few minutes walking from the conference is one of Brussels' largest and parks, the Bois de la Cambre. Within the park there are various pop-up bars as well as a few fashionable restaurants.

Cimetière d'Ixelles

A square filled with bars frequented by students of the ULB, about 5 minutes walking of the Solbosch campus. Bars and restaurants extend into Chaussée de Boondael and Avenue des Saisons.

Chatelain

Tram 8, stop Bailli/Baljuw, is about 10 minutes away and brings one to Rue du Bailli and the Square du Chatelain, lively areas famous for their art nouveau architecture as well as for both student and trendy crowds.

Fernand Cocq, St Boniface, Matonge

Fernand Cocq is also served by bus 71. The trip takes about 15 minutes from the conference venue. On this somewhat smaller square is located the town hall of Ixelles, as well as several cocktail bars and a few restaurants. Just a few minutes walking or one bus stop further is St Boniface, which hosts a larger number of restaurants. St Boniface borders on Matonge, a quarter with mainly African-food-oriented restaurants.
